## **By Court – Judgment:**

I have read the Petition filed by the Petitioner on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of January 2023.

I have further considered the evidence adduced by the Petitioner through his witness statement and Exhibit A (a photo of the Parties at their marriage celebration).

I am of the considered opinion that the following facts are established on record;

- 1) The facts that the Parties are married under the Ordinance.
- 2) The fact that the Parties have 3 children who are all above 18 years of age.
- 3) The fact that the Respondent has deserted the marriage, and
- 4) The fact that the Parties have not lived together as husband and wife for a continuous period of 12 years immediately preceeding the presentation of the instant Divorce Petition.

Upon the above facts and in light of Sections 2(1) (c) and of the Matrimonial Causes Act, 1971 (Act 367), I find and hold that the Ordinance Marriage celebrated between the Parties herein at

the Registrar of Marriages Office in Accra sometime in July 1998 has broken down beyond reconciliation.

The said marriage is accordingly dissolved this 13<sup>th</sup> day of October 2023.

The Registrar of this court shall issue a Divorce Certificate to the Parties herein.
