GRANT OF A PARDON

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME

WHEREAS EDWARD EUGENE BANKYI OFORI-ATTA was, on the 1st day of November, 1950 at the Assizes held in Accra before his Honour Mr. Justice Lingley, convicted on one count of attempted fraud by false pretences contrary to sections 44 and 276 of the Criminal Code then in force, and was for the said offence sentenced to two years' imprisonment with hard labour:

AND WHEREAS it is in the judgment of the Presidential Commission expedient that a FREE PARDON should be granted to the said EDWARD EUGENE BANKYI OFORI-ATTA in respect of the said offence:

NOW THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred on the Presidential Commission by Article 50 of the Constitution the Presidential Commission acting in consultation with the Council of State HEREBY GRANTS unto the said EDWARD EUGENE BANKYI OFORI-ATTA a free, absolute and unconditional pardon for the offence whereof he was convicted as aforesaid, thereby pardoning, remitting and releasing unto him all disabilities and disqualifications whatsoever that from the said conviction may ensue.
