NOTICE TO MEDICAL AND DENTAL PRACTITIONERS WHO HAVE NEVER REGISTERED UNDER THE MEDICAL AND DENTAL ACT, 1959 (No. 36 OF 1959)

Medical and Dental Practitioners who have never registered under the Medical and Dental Act, 1959 (No. 36 of 1959) and who are practising medicine or dentistry in Ghana are reminded that such practice is an offence under section 23 of the Medical and Dental Act, 1959 punishable on conviction by a fine not exceeding two hundred new cedis with a further amount of twenty new cedis a day during the continuance of the offence, or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding twelve months or to both such fine and imprisonment.

In order to avoid prosecution every such unregistered practitioner is advised to submit to—

SCHOLARSHIPS SECRETARIAT
INTER-AFRICAN UNIVERSITIES SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMME: FORESTRY, DENTISTRY, VETERINARY
MEDICINE, LIBRARIANSHIP AND B.A. (FRENCH) 1971–72 AWARDS

A number of awards for degree courses in Forestry, Dentistry, Veterinary Medicine and Librarianship and B.A. (Hons.) French are being made under the Inter-African Universities Scholarship Programme of the Association of African Universities. These awards, tenable at African Universities, commence in October, 1971–72 academic year.

2. Applications are invited from suitably qualified Ghanaians who will not have reached their twenty-seventh birthday by 1st October, 1971.

Qualifications:

- (a) *Forestry*—at University of Ibadan, Nigeria. Candidates must have passed in at least five subjects, including English Language and Mathematics at G.C.E. "O" Level with two of either Physics, Mathematics, Chemistry, Botany or Zoology at "A" Level.
- (b) *Dentistry*—at University of Lagos, Nigeria and Lovanium University, Congo-Kinshasa. Candidates must have passed in at least five subjects, including English Language, Mathematics and French at G.C.E. "O" Level and two "A" Level subjects selected from Chemistry, Physics, Botany or Biology.
- (c) *Veterinary Medicine*—at the University of East Africa, Nairobi and Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria, Nigeria and Khartoum University. Candidates must have passed in at least five subjects at G.C.E. "O" Level with two "A" Level passes in Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology (or Biology).
- (d) *Librarianship*—at Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria, Nigeria. Candidates must be graduates who must be first degree holders and who will take Librarianship as a career.
- (e) *Licentiate: B.A. (Hons.) Degree*—at Dakar, Abidjan and Yaounde Universities. Candidates must have passed in at least five subjects at G.C.E. "O" Level including French and English Language and two "A" Level subjects in French and one other language.

3. Students who already possess the "A" Level Certificates are eligible.

VACANCIES FOR LEARNER LABORATORY TECHNICIAN

Applications are invited from suitably qualified persons to undergo a three-year course of training leading to the appointment as Technical Officer (Laboratory).

The course will be partly undertaken in the laboratory and on board research vessels at sea.

DISTRICT MAGISTRATES GRADE I

Duties.—These include the trial of cases both criminal and civil, conducting preliminary enquiries in more serious criminal cases, acting as Coroners and *ex officio* Commissioners for Affidavits and as Notaries Public, and also being responsible for the preparation of lists of Jurors.

DISTRICT MAGISTRATES GRADE II

Qualifications.—Applicants must be Ghanaians, enrolled on the Roll of Lawyers in Ghana, and be of at least 18 months standing as legal practitioners.
