Statutory Declarations Bill

MEMORANDUM

The Bill replaces the Statutory Declarations Act, 1835, which is one of the English statutes of general application continued in force by the First Schedule to the Courts Act, 1971. It provides a useful means of making declarations concerning matters not referable to court proceedings for example where there is doubt concerning the date of a person's birth, where a declaration in respect of assets, rights, interests or liabilities is required, where a statement as to a person's identity is required or where a declaration as to the truthfulness of statements made to prove disputed facts not relating to court proceedings is required. In other cases affidavits will continue to be used as before.

2. Clause 1, following section 13 of the Act of 1835, restricts the use of affidavits to matters connected with court proceedings and cases where affidavits are authorised to be sworn by statute. Clause 2 provides that although statutory declarations should be used in other cases, an affidavit sworn otherwise than as provided by clause 1 shall not be ineffective but shall be deemed to be a statutory declaration.

3. Clauses 3 and 4 set out the form of declaration and the procedure for making it. Clause 5 makes it an offence to make a false declaration in certain circumstances. Clauses 6 and 7 are supplemental.

Draft of a Bill

ENTITLED

THE STATUTORY DECLARATIONS ACT, 1971

AN ACT to provide for the making of statutory declarations.

BE IT ENACTED by the President and the National Assembly in this present Parliament assembled as follows:—

1 1. After the commencement of this Act, no affidavit shall be sworn for any purpose, except— Restriction on use of affidavits.

5 (a) where it relates to any proceeding, application or other matter commenced in any court or referable thereto; or

(b) where under the provisions of any enactment an affidavit is authorised to be sworn.

10 2. In every case to which section 1 does not apply, a person wishing to depose to any fact for any purpose may do so by means of a statutory declaration: Use of statutory declarations.

Provided that where any person has sworn to an affidavit for any purpose other than a purpose referred to in section 1, such affidavit shall nevertheless be deemed for all purposes to be a statutory declaration.

Form of

3. A statutory declaration shall be made in the following form:— 1

"I,
(full names and address)

solemnly and sincerely declare that.....

and I make this solemn declaration conscientiously believing 5
it to be true, in accordance with the Statutory Declara-
tions Act, 1971."

Procedure
for making
statutory
declaration.

4. Every magistrate, notary public, commissioner for oaths and
any other person authorised by law to administer an oath may
take and receive the statutory declaration of any person voluntarily 10
making it before him, and shall certify it under his signature.

Offence.

5. Any person who makes a statutory declaration which he knows
to be false in a material particular, or who makes a declaration
false in a material particular, reckless whether it be true or not, shall
be guilty of a misdemeanour. 15

Fees.

6. The fees payable on the taking of an affidavit shall likewise
be payable on the making of a statutory declaration.

Repeals.

7. (1) The Statutory Declarations Act, 1835 (5 & 6 Will. IV, c.62)
shall cease to apply in Ghana, and accordingly the reference to that
Act in the First Schedule to the Courts Act, 1971 is hereby repealed. 20

(2) Section 11 (2) of the Oaths Act, 1960 (C.A. 12) is hereby
repealed.
