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MINISTRY OF EDUCATION
COMMONWEALTH EDUCATION STUDY FELLOWSHIP SCHEME

It is proposed to award a number of fellowships for training in the United Kingdom for Teachers and other Educational personnel in 1972-73. Awards will be available for qualified citizens of Ghana in the following fields of study:

(a) POSTGRADUATE STUDIES

(Preferably leading to Masters' degree or postgraduate diplomas or certificates.)

- (i) Biology
- (ii) English
- (iii) Economics

Qualifications.—Candidates must have at least a second class honours degree and a professional qualification in Education. Preference will be given to candidates holding the senior subject master post or its equivalent. Successful candidates will be expected to work at the Inspectorate Division of the Ministry on completion of training.

(iv) Educational and Vocational Guidance and Counselling

Qualifications.—Candidates must possess a professional qualification in Education and at least two years of post-graduation teaching experience. Successful candidates will be expected to join the Curriculum Research and Development Unit, Ministry of Education on completion of training.

(v) Textbook Production

Qualifications.—Candidates must be graduates of a recognised University, preferably with an honours degree in English and a professional qualification in Education plus at least 5 years' teaching experience as well as a proven aptitude for writing. The successful candidate will be expected to return to join the Information and Publications Unit of the Ministry of Education on completion of training.

(vi) Curriculum Development in Science

Qualifications.—Candidates must be Science graduates with a professional qualification in Education. The successful candidates will return to work in the Science Unit of the Ministry of Education on completion of training.

(vii) Statistics for Educational Planning

(viii) Educational Budgeting

Qualifications.—Candidates must be graduates with a professional degree in Education, an aptitude for figures and at least two years' postgraduate teaching experience. The successful candidates will be expected to return to work in the Educational Planning Unit of the Ministry of Education.

(b) POST-DIPLOMA COURSES

(i) Home Science

Qualifications.—Candidates must possess a Home Science Diploma and should have taught for at least three years as a diplomate. The successful candidates will be considered on completion of her training for appointment as head of the Home Science Department of a training college offering a special course in Home Science.

(ii) Certificate of Education and Administration

Qualifications.—Candidates must have had at least 2 years of post-certificate "A" training in Home Science together with experience of Home Science administration and supervision in the field or as head of a Home Science Department in an institution. The successful candidate will on completion of training return to join the Ministry of Education and to carry out administration and supervision of Home Science teaching.

(iii) Nursery School Education (in a Froebel institution or elsewhere)

Qualifications.—Candidates must be a Senior Teacher or a Tutor or a member of staff of the Ministry of Education with a demonstrated interest in the education of pre-school children. The successful candidate will on completion of training return to work with the Nursery Education Unit of the Ministry of Education.

(iv) Audio-Visual Aids Technician Course

Qualifications.—Candidates must possess the requisite City and Guilds of London qualification. The successful candidate will on completion of training return to work with the Curriculum Research and Development Unit, Ministry of Education as a technician responsible for the maintenance and operation of audio-visual aids.

(c) SPECIAL EDUCATION

- (i) Education of the Blind
- (ii) Education of the Deaf

Qualifications.—Candidates must be teachers with experience of education of the blind or deaf. Successful candidates will on completion of their training be employed to teach in an institution for the deaf or blind.
