VACANCIES FOR SENIOR VALUATION OFFICERS

Applications are invited from suitably qualified persons for appointment to the post of Senior Valuation Officer in the Ministry of Local Government.

Qualifications and Experience.—Candidates must

- (i) be Associate Members of the Commonwealth Institute of Valuers, or the Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors, or the Ghana Institution of Surveyors or equivalent professional body, and
- (ii) have had at least 5 years' post-qualification experience in a major Valuation Department or in private practice.

Duties:

- (i) To be responsible for over-all supervision of valuation programmes in a Region.
- (ii) To give directions as to valuation procedures and principles to be adopted in a Region.
- (iii) To evaluate annual reports submitted by District Heads for submission to the Commissioner of Valuation.
- (iv) To examine the most difficult cases of objections and arrange and preside at Conferences between Departmental Officials and objectors or their representatives.
- (v) To advise Heads of other Departments, Authorities and Institutions in the Region on rating and valuation matters as required.
- (vi) To examine and approve documents and exhibits prepared as evidence in major appeal cases and may conduct some of the appeal cases personally.
- (vii) To instruct on probable future impact of new rating and valuation principles and precedents emanating from Court decisions.
- (viii) To be responsible for over-all administration of a Regional Valuation Office.

Salary.—Ranges 73, 75 (G4,776–G5,676).

VACANCIES FOR LEARNER TECHNICAL OFFICERS (FORESTRY)

Applications are invited from suitably qualified persons to undergo a three-year course of training beginning in July, 1975. Approximately one year of the course will be undertaken in the field and two years at the School of Forestry, Sunyani.

2. *Qualifications:*

- (a) Candidates who may be male or female must have completed a full course of Secondary School education in Science, and possess the General Certificate of Education or the West African School Certificate with passes (Grade 7 or better) in English and Mathematics and a Grade 6 or better pass in at least one of the following subjects: Biology, Physics, Chemistry, General Science, Additional General Science.
- (b) Candidates for the June 1975 West African School Certificate Examinations may apply on producing satisfactory evidence that they have gone through the required course of training in Science and entered for the examination in the required subjects. Such candidates will not normally be admitted until they obtain the qualifications listed at paragraph 2 (a) above.
- (c) Age limits: 16–25 years.

3. Candidates selected for training must have a certificate of fitness from a Government Medical Officer before being accepted for training.

4. *Allowances.*—Learners qualified under 2 (a) above will be paid allowances at the rate of ¢948.00 per annum during the First Year, ¢984.00 per annum during the Second Year and ¢1,020.00 per annum during the Third Year. Candidates qualified under paragraph 2 (b) will be paid at ¢648, ¢684 and ¢720 per annum until they obtain the required qualifications.

5. Furnished accommodation and services are provided in the School at a low charge. Learners are also required to pay for the cost of messing.

6. *Bond.*—Learners will be bonded for ¢500.00 to complete the course and to serve for five years in any subsequent appointment in the Forestry Department.

7. Learners who successfully complete the course will be eligible for appointment as Technical Officers (Forestry) on the Salary Scale R.35, 42, i.e. ¢1,428 x ¢48–¢1,620; ¢1,788 x ¢60–¢2,028.
